

'The Last Crop' film screening set Friday at Davis High

"The Last Crop" will be screened from 7 to 9 p.m. Friday, presented by Davis Farm To School Connection and Slow Food Yolo, at the Brunelle Performance Hall at Davis High School, 315 W. 14th St.

Filmmaker Chuck Schultz and local farmers Jeff and Annie Main of Good Humus Produce will be there for the special screening of the 23- minute work-in-progress. The film explores the struggles of sustaining small farms and passing them on to the next generation of farmers.

Schultz explores the Mains' idea of setting up a land trust to ensure that their land will continue on as a productive, sustainable farming operation.

All event proceeds benefit Davis Farm to School Connection (<http://www.davisfarmtoschool.org>) and Davis High School's Future Farmers of America program. These programs promote small farms like Good Humus by sponsoring farm visits for second-graders in Davis public schools and by instilling in our next generation a genuine respect for local farmland and local farmers.
